

City of Riverside Series: Downtown Riverside

HISTORY

Riverside was founded in 1870 by John W. North and the Southern California Colony Association. Then in 1873 a woman by the name of Eliza Tibbets planted two navel orange trees. The citrus trees thrived in the warm days and cold nights. The orange navel trees had a reputation of being sweet, seedless, and easy to peel. Eventually, Riverside became one of America's citrus' capitols.

The citrus industry brought wealth to Riverside in twoways. First, through the growing and selling of citrus, second, through travel. Travelers would come to Riverside for both the climate and the citrus.

"In 1895, Riverside enjoyed the highest per capita income in the country, and that level of wealth continued for years to come." This assisted in developing "the small agriculture town into a thriving city".
